






Lyric: divergent		Notes

	impervious (adj.) - unable to be penetrated, unaffected Sofia bundled up so she would be <i>impervious</i> to the cold.

preponderance (n.) - a great amount or frequency The forensic team found a <i>preponderance</i> of evidence against the accused.
